Time to think about attendance

With the start of a new year, it is a good time to keep an eye on our school attendance. While most of the children in school have excellent attendance, there are a few children who have, for whatever reason, had a lot of time off so far this year. We have a school target to maintain at least 97% attendance. Recent months have seen our average fall to an average of between 94% and 95%.

We understand that there are many reasons why children are absent from school. There has been a lot of illness recently, including a recent raise in Covid levels. It is very important when children are genuinely sick that they stay home to prevent spread. However, there are occasions when children could be in school but for whatever reason they are at home. This leads to learning being missed and gaps in understanding and progress developing.

This term, we need to work together to ensure that every child makes the most of the fantastic learning opportunities that are on offer at Archbishop Hutton's.

Water Awareness Lessons

Class 3 and 4 were visited by teachers from Brockhole on Windermere to learn all about our use of water. They looked at what we use water for, how much we use, how we can save water and where our water comes from and goes. They also looked at what not to flush.

At the end of the session the children made a "water saving promise" that they are challenged to keep over the next 6 weeks.
