

DRESS LIKE A SCIENTIST DAY

Friday the 26th November will be Dress like a Scientist day. You can dress in whatever clothes you like - a ballet tutu, a football kit, a farmer, a delivery driver or a skater - as long as you have a piece of paper which explains the science.

Example: Footballers rely on the forces of gravity to keep the ball down, they use a push force to kick the ball and have to be very fit and healthy to perform.

Dancers need balance and they need to be able to spin without falling over. They need strength from eating well and getting lots of sleep.

Join in and have a go. There will be a certificate for everyone who can explain why their costume.
