Class 1 Visit St Oswalds





Home Learning Activities

Before the week we have a great challenge to have a go at. Children should complete this and bring it in on **Science Day (Friday 8th)**

Design a Science Box.

We did this two years ago. Create something scientific inside a cardboard box. It could be:



- A solar system
- A habitat (under the sea, farm, woods etc)
- A science event (Moon landing, Mary Anning finding fossils, Wright Brothers flight, the first TV signal etc)
- An explanation of science (how rainbow is made, water cycle, colours, digestion etc)

During the week, there will be lots of Science and STEM activities happening in class. **Parents are invited to school at 1:15 on Friday 8th** to take part in some investigations and visit our Science Box exhibition.
