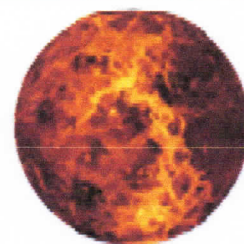

✓ This week in school.....

- ✓ On Monday, our four Key Stage 2 School Councillors attended the first meeting this academic year of Lancaster and Morecambe Pupil Parliament. They joined children from many other local schools at Morecambe and Lancaster College to learn about plans for the Eden Project. They had a really interesting day and returned to school buzzing from this experience. The School Councillors have some follow up tasks about the Eden Project to complete in consultation with their class mates. They will be working on these tasks in the next few weeks.
- ✓ On Wednesday morning Miss Watson met the eight Year 6 Team Captains (each team has two team captains) to plan the introduction of Team Thursday. On Thursday lunchtimes from 12.30 to 1.00, team captains will organise both indoor and outdoor activities (depending on the weather) for the children in each team. The aims are for children to have an opportunity to play with their team once a week, to provide a wider range of lunchtime activities and for Team Captains to take responsibility for organising and leading this. Our first Team Thursday will be next week!
- ✓ On Wednesday afternoon School Council gathered for their first meeting. They have three key tasks for this term. The first task is to decide how they would spend £20,000 to ensure a lasting health legacy for our community should they win Aldi's sticker competition. The second task is to collate feedback from every class following their Anti-Bullying Week lesson and then agree a follow-up action plan. The third task is to collect children's ideas for the Eden Project to take to the next Pupil Parliament meeting in March.
- ✓ On Friday morning Class 1 and Class 2 caught the train to Lancaster to visit Lancaster Priory. This month, the historic church will host one of the world's most awe-inspiring artworks – a massive moon – suspended from its ancient rafters.

GB Paralympian



Craig McCann

Craig grew up in Doncaster and was a bit more interested in music rather than sport. In 2004, Craig was due to join the RAF when doctors discovered a brain tumor during a routine medical check which left him disabled. Craig decided to challenge himself despite his disability so he took up Para-fencing where he's gone on to become British National Champion and compete at the London 2012 Paralympic Games. After a successful career as a fencer, Craig has now transitioned to Para-cycling where he's become T2 British National Champion.
