This half-term the Natural World is the Science focus for each class' curriculum theme: Class I and Class 2 are learning about the seasons, animals & plants and their habitats; Class 3 will be classifying animals & plants and exploring different habitats; Class 4 will be studying the Solar System and Light.

Class 2 have already been up to Warton Crag on Thursday to look at nest materials the local birds use. The children did some birdwatching and were fortunate to see a peregrine falcon, a buzzard, jackdaws, ravens, jays and wood pigeons amongst others. They also noticed a large bird box for owls. How serious is the coronavirus?

- it can cause flu-like symptoms, including fever, cough & difficulty breathing
- the infection is not serious for most people, including children
- there is currently no vaccine
- most people get better with enough rest, water to drink and medicine for pain

How likely are you to catch the virus?

- you can only catch it if you have been close to a person who has the virus
- the chance of being in contact with the virus is currently low in the UK
- if you have travelled to areas where many people are infected, your chance of catching the virus is higher, i.e. China and any affected areas
