Lancaster City Council are administering the Emergency Assistance Grant Scheme within the District, this may be of use to some of your parents.

The Local Authority Emergency Assistance Grant Scheme has been introduced to support people who are struggling to afford food and other essential items due to financial hardship caused by Covid-19. This scheme is temporary. The scheme can help with short-term living costs such as food, gas and electric, essential household appliances and school uniforms. Cash will not usually be awarded.

The eligibility for the scheme is:

- Aged 16 years or over
- A resident of the Lancaster City Council district

• Experiencing financial hardship as a direct result of Covid-19 and not have enough resources to meet your immediate short-term needs

- On a low income or in receipt of one of the following benefits:
- o Universal Credit
- o Jobseeker's Allowance
- o Employment Support Allowance
- o Income Support
- o Pension Credit

What do I do if I think we could have Coronavirus?

Here is our weekly reminder of the guidance about Covid19 and the symptoms. When should you keep your child home and seek a test? The advice given on the Department for Education website is this:

What symptoms should schools be looking out for? How can schools tell if pupil has just a

cold, or whether it might be coronavirus? The Department for Education has worked closely with Public Health England (PHE) and NHS Test and Trace to ensure that we are doing all we can to minimise the potential risks of spread. A key part of this is recognising the correct symptoms.

It is recommended that pupils and staff who feel unwell, get tested if:

They develop one or more of the main coronavirus symptoms: a high temperature; a new, continuous cough; or the loss or change of their sense of taste or smell;

or

They are recommended to get tested by a healthcare provider (e.g. GP or nurse).



If a child is tested because they are unwell, they should stay off school until they receive a result. As in any year, as schools go back, children may pick up common colds or feel unwell with a sore throat, stomach upset or a headache. These children may need to stay off school and parents/carers should call their GP or dial 111 to seek medical advice if they are concerned about their child's health.



Keep up the hard work on the reading, spelling and times tables the test results show great progress this term.

Mr Pugh's Winter Challenge is on the website next week. There is **30TP** on offer for every piece of work

done. The **Great Big Show and Tell** for the Autumn Challenge is next week and the Winter one will be in February. You can bring in work then, or it can be uploaded onto the pupil area of the class website.

If we have to close a bubble because of Covid19 we will use the website Pupil Area to keep in touch and set daily work for the class. This will be in a similar manner to the way work was set during the national lockdown period earlier in the year.
