




**PUPIL AREA VERIFICATION CODE – 111984**

Follow these instructions below if you are unsure of how to access your child's home learning.

We use the school website to send home our learning activities. You need to log on to the pupil area at the top of the page. You will need your name/password and verification number which is – 111984. If you do it correctly you will see this.




Next, click on View all Homework.

When you have done the activity, you can take a photo of it, press this button and follow the instructions to upload and share your work.



Please note that any emails, work uploads or other enquiries will only be commented on or replied to during school hours – between 9:00am and 4:30pm.

Lancaster City Council are administering the Emergency Assistance Grant Scheme within the District, this may be of use to some of you at this time. The Local Authority Emergency Assistance Grant Scheme has been introduced to support people who are struggling to afford food and other essential items due to financial hardship caused by Covid-19. This scheme is temporary. The scheme can help with short-term living costs such as food, gas and electric, essential household appliances and school uniforms. Cash will not usually be awarded.

The eligibility for the scheme is:

- Aged 16 years or over
- A resident of the Lancaster City Council district
- Experiencing financial hardship as a direct result of Covid-19 and not have enough resources to meet your immediate short-term needs
- On a low income or in receipt of one of the following benefits:
  - o Universal Credit
  - o Jobseeker's Allowance
  - o Employment Support Allowance
  - o Income Support
  - o Pension Credit
